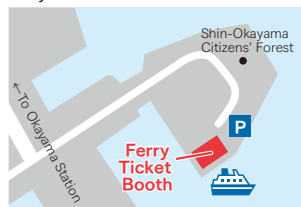

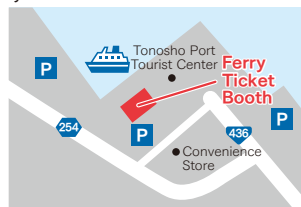

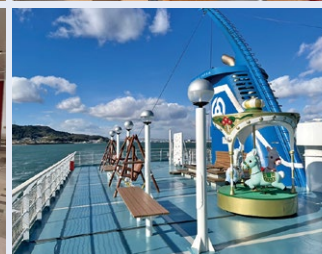
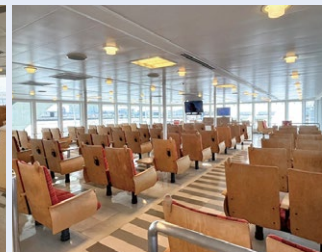


### Olympia Dream

### Nakayama Senmaida

One of Japan's nationally protected '100 Terraced Rice Fields,' 800 paddies of all sizes cascade down these steep slopes. This peaceful view works wonders for an aching soul.

### Nishinotaki

The oldest of Shodoshima's '88 Sacred Sites'. Said to be the training place of Kobo-Daishi, revered founder of the Shingon school of Buddhism.



### KasaneIwa

A boulder held in place by a mysterious force, worshipped as the vessel of a god by the local Koseishizuchi Shrine. Climb their giant stone staircase and witness the entire inland sea in all its cerulean glory.



### Hishio no Sato

Local soy sauce breweries perfume the surrounding roads with a rich, savory aroma. Take a stroll through these timeless slices of tradition and history dating back over a full century and a half. Guided tours are also available.
